Township to Hold Purple Heart Ceremony on Tuesday, August 7th at 6 pm

All are invited to attend the Hillsborough Township's annual Purple Heart Ceremony on Tuesday, August 7th at 6 pm at the Garden of Honor on the grounds of the Municipal Complex. This significant commemoration ceremony in honor of the Military Order of the Purple Heart will be held rain or shine and will be followed by light refreshments.

The Purple Heart, the most recognized medal of the armed forces, is awarded to those serving in the armed forces that are injured or killed while serving in combat. It was originally introduced by George Washington as the Badge of Military Merit in 1782. It is the oldest military award given to U.S. military members.



The Purple Heart Monument that resides in the Township's Garden of Honor was dedicated on behalf of Chapter 27 of the Military Order of the Purple Heart at the first Purple Heart Ceremony in 2012.

Eagle Scout Jack Cummings Honored by Mayor and Township Committee

Jack Cummings, a Sophomore at Hillsborough High School and a member of Boy Scout Troop 186, has recently earned the status of Eagle Scout.

Jack's Eagle Scout Project consisted of constructing a Bocce court for Brookdale Senior Living. The project took over 150 hours to complete with the assistance of 18 other people over the course of 4 days. The cost of the project was \$1035 which Jack raised by baking and selling cookies, in addition to receiving donations from AGWAY, Opdyke Lumber, Lowes and Central Jersey Nurseries.

Jack served as Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Historian, Librarian, Troop Guide, Den Chief, Quartermaster, Patrol Leader and Assistant Patrol Leader. He is a member of the Order of the Arrow and Boy Scout Honor Society.

He has a 2nd degree Black Belt and teaches Taekwondo to children at ATA Legacy Martial Arts. Jack also volunteers at Brookdale Senior Living, Toys for Tots and the Hillsborough Food Bank.

We extend our sincere congratulations to Jack Cummings for having achieved the status of Eagle Scout, an honor for both him and for those who guided him, with best wishes for a bright future.



"The printing of the calendar is funded through the various advertisements contained within the calendar," added Mayor McCauley.





Department Updates

Building Department

Closing Out Permits

With summer here, it is the peak of the construction season. Don't forget, once you receive your Construction Permit it is important to get all of your inspections. Permits will remain open until all final inspections have passed. This is important to remember, especially when selling your home!

Engineering

Summer has arrived and many homeowners may want to improve their property by adding or removing soil.

Soil Permit Ordinance

The Engineering Department is advising residents to be cautious about accepting soil for their property. Some have accepted soil from locations which could possibly contain debris, rubble or other contaminants. In one case, a resident accepted "free" soil which ended up being contaminated material. The homeowner had to pay to have the soil removed and afterwards learned the soil was from a construction site. The free soil turned out to be a very expensive undertaking. It is recommended you purchase soil from an approved soil supplier or make sure they are certified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Agency.

Hillsborough Township has a Soil Permit Ordinance designed to protect residents against such occurrences. It prohibits the importation of soil without first obtaining approval from the Engineering Department. If the soil is from an unknown source lab testing of the soil will be necessary. If you are thinking of improving your property, before you either remove or accept soil, dirt or other fill material, be sure to contact the Engineering Department to advise and obtain the proper permit. The Hillsborough Engineering Office can be reached at 908-369-4460.

Following the proper procedures can save residents from significant costs associated with removal of contaminated soil as well as preventing penalties.

Finance

3rd Quarter Estimated Tax Bills

The 3rd Quarter estimated taxes were mailed on July 11th. These bills only reflect the amount due for the 3rd quarter until the Township receives the certified tax rate from the county. If you earned a Shop Hillsborough credit, this bill will reflect that reduction. Please be aware the estimated tax bill is a single sheet that is pink and white, and that payment is due no later than August 10th.

Recall Information

Recently, the Health Department was informed that there were 2 recalls of commonly consumed food products that residents should be aware of. Recalled items include certain types of Ritz Crackers, and certain types of Pepperidge Farms Goldfish Crackers. VFW Post # 8371 has recently installed the following officers to lead the organization for the fiscal year July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.



Potential Dangers by the Pool

Sunburn, unsafe swimming and sweltering temperatures are not the only concerns when heading to the pool on a bright summer day. Exposure to pool chemicals pose potentially serious health concerns. Poison Center experts often see an uptick in calls involving both children and adults during the swimming season.

CASE: Caller in his 30's developed coughing and shortness of breath after routine pool maintenance. Symptoms developed after opening pool chemical containers in his shed, which had poor ventilation.

CASE: Caller stated siblings younger than 10 years old were playing out in their backyard. A pool chemical container was left on the patio, in the sun with the lid unsecured. Children developed breathing problems after opening the lid and inhaling the chemical's fumes.

"Pool safety includes safe handling of pool chemicals," says Diane Calello, MD, NJ Poison Control Center Executive and Medical Director, Rutgers NJ Medical School's Department of Emergency Medicine . "Some pool and hot tub chemicals, which are necessary to prevent the growth of harmful bacteria in the water, can be dangerous and must be used and stored properly. For example, chlorine can cause eye irritation, breathing problems and lung injury if used in high concentrations or in poorly ventilated enclosed spaces."

The NJ Poison Control Center offers the following tips for the safe handling and storage of swimming pool and hot tub chemicals:

- Store chemicals in a lockable area out of sight and reach of children and pets. Keep them in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area out of the sun.
- Read and follow the safety directions on the product's label during each use. Always keep
 chlorine and other chemicals in their original containers to avoid confusion and possible
 accidental ingestion.
- Never mix chemicals together; the combination could create a toxic gas which could have lifethreatening effects. This risk also applies to mixing chemicals with ammonia.
- Chlorine should never be ingested. Avoid shaking chlorine containers to minimize dust, fumes and splashes. Avoid touching chlorine with bare hands.
- Open all chemicals in well-ventilated areas, preferably outdoors. Keep chlorine away from other combustible substances.
- When transporting chemicals, separate incompatible chemicals and tightly secure them to prevent spills.
- Be aware that swimming in chlorinated water can have the following effects: skin irritation that can trigger rashes; burning, itchy eyes; and can trigger or aggravate bronchial problems including asthma.
