

Department Updates

Building Department

Winterize Your Home

Autumn is here and Winter is just around the corner. Don't wait until it is too late to start winterizing your home. When water inside pipes freezes, it causes pressure inside the pipe, and when the pressure get too high, the pipe ruptures. We recommend to insulate pipes in crawl spaces to create warmth. Also, If you are planning on leaving for an extended period of time, do not shut your heat off completely.

Engineering

Engineering Inspections in the Winter Months

The Engineering Department reminds residents that site inspections cannot be conducted if the area to be inspected is snow covered.

If additions, pole barns, garages, driveways, in ground swimming pools etc. are in the process of being constructed and a resident needs a final Engineering site inspection for certificate of occupancy it is recommended that the site work be completed before it becomes snow covered.

If the inspection needs to be delayed until spring, the Engineering Department requires that a cash escrow be submitted and a temporary certificate of occupancy be issued until the site work can be verified. Once the site work is verified, the cash escrow can be returned and a permanent certificate of occupancy can be issued.

Finance Department

Dog License Renewal

The Finance Department will begin mailing out 2019 Dog License renewals in mid-December. Payments for these renewals cannot be made until January 2nd. Pet owners are reminded that, in order to renew your dog's license, their rabies vaccine must be valid through October 2019. Please watch the Township website for the date and time of the 2019 annual rabies clinic.

Health Department

Flu Vaccination Clinics

Flu Vaccination Clinics will be held in cooperation with Walgreens of Hillsborough on the following dates: Tuesday, October 2, and October 16 from 3 to 6 PM at the Hillsborough Municipal Building. Please see the Hillsborough website, Health Department, "Get Ready for the Flu" for cost and acceptable insurances.

Radon Kits

The Health Department is distributing free radon test kits to residents on a first come, first served basis. These kits are not intended for residences built after 2002. If you live in a house that was never tested and was built on or before January 1, 2002, these kits will help you to determine your risk and what prevention system, if any, is necessary. One kit per residence will be provided.



Free Rabies Vaccination Clinic

The Health Department will provide free rabies vaccinations to cats and dogs of NJ residents in January 2019. Please check back on our website in December.

OEM



On Saturday, November 3, 2018 a group of Red Cross volunteers ran a fantastic day-long training on Shelter Fundamentals at Raritan Valley Community College for Red Cross Volunteers, Municipal and County CERT, OEM and first responders. More than 50 participants came from all over New Jersey, but primarily from Somerset and Hunterdon Counties to brush up on and learn about things like planning and readiness, resourcing a shelter, opening, operating and closing a shelter. Hillsborough officials in attendance included OEM Director John Sheridan, Social Services Director Bob Wagner and OEM Deputy Director Pamela Borek.

Once out of the classroom sessions, participants could partake in a shelter simulation activity where they operated three key components of a shelter: registration, dormitory set-up and feeding. It was a realistic exercise that should others need to implement will prove very helpful. Many thanks to Carmella and Tommy Ditmars for organizing this training, and to all Red Crossers for sharing their expertise and experiences.

Public Works

Leaf Program Information

Hillsborough Township provides both a [Leaf Pick Up](#) and a [Drop Off Program](#), which runs from November 1st through the end of December. The Drop Off program is located at the Auten Road Facility. The purpose of this program is to assist residents with the removal of fallen leaves.

Residents are urged to please have their leaves ready at the edge of the curb line on their own property and to contain them if they are blowing on your neighbors property using the methods suggested from the Department of Public works link on the town website. It is now the middle of December and the second rounds of collection are well under way. We continue to update the town website weekly with the general areas being addressed.
