### Hillsborough Health Department Business Highlight:

The Hillsborough Health Department has come across some exceptional attention to detail while conducting their observational surveys and inspections. This week the Hillsborough Health Department wanted to highlight Wawa, at 381 Triangle Rd, for going above and beyond service in implementing protocols to break the chain of infection for Covid-19, and make customers feel safe to shop there. Wawa has a coffee-by-order option to help enforce a strict 6 foot social distancing practice. ### RECYCLING DROP OFF LOCATIONS AND HOURS

If you miss a recycle day or have a large amount of recyclable material, residents can drop off certain recyclables at the Somerset County Recycling Center, 40 Pohnemus Lane, Bridgewater NJ, on the 1st Saturday of each month, from 9am to 2pm. Acceptable recyclables include newspapers, magazines, junk mail, clean/dry cardboard, phone books, shredded paper, all plastics #1-7, microwave ovens, aluminum, steel, tin metal cans, used motor oil and tires (3 gallon maximum), glass bottles, scrap metal, passenger tires (limit of 8). ### NON-MANDATED MATERIALS

The following are items that cannot be placed in your curbside recycle containers:

- Carpeting and ceiling tiles:** Can be brought to CarpetCycle, LLC. (973-732-8556) by Empty Inner cartidges. Accepted at Laser Saw, (732) 431-3339
- Textiles:** Used textiles can be recycled at local charity donation bins. Textile bins are located in the upper parking lot of the municipal building, 379 south branch road (near the soccer fields), in the parking lot in front of WeesKortjes (210 US Highway 206), and in the parking lot near Amvel Auto and Tire Center, 626 US Highway 206.
- Light Bulbs:** CFL light bulbs are accepted at Household Hazardous Waste Drop off Days.
- Smells Detectors:** Smoke detectors can be returned to the company that manufactured them. Contact manufacturer for details.
- Propane tank disposal:** Propane tanks without overfill protection devices are no longer permitted to be refilled. They can be disposed of at Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Days.

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Somerset county is offering 5 Hazardous waste days. All Somerset county homeowners can participate (proof of residency required):

Common items that **WILL BE** accepted at these Hazardous Waste Days include:

- Ammonia based cleaners
- Fire extinguishers
- Gasoline
- Rechargeable & button cell batteries
- Auto products: motor oil (5 gal. maximum), antifreeze, trans. Fluid, car batteries, etc.
- Pesticides
- Fluorescent Lights
- Pool chemicals
- Mercury
- Propane tanks

Items that **WILL NOT BE** accepted at these Hazardous Waste Days include:

- 55 gallon drums
- Air conditioners/air conditioning units
- Carbon monoxide detectors
- Explosives
- Single alarms
- needles
- tires (max of 8 per person)

## [NJ American Water Tips for Wise Water Use](#)

- **Reuse it.** Use water from rain barrels and kiddie pools for watering lawn and gardens.
- **Embrace the bucket!** Instead of using a running hose, use water contained in a bucket for washing cars and pets, and rinsing sandy/grassy feet.
- **Timing is everything.** Only water during the coolest parts of the day (early morning or evening) to minimize evaporation. Also, be aware of which plants don't need to be watered every day.
- **Odd/Even Watering of your lawn.** Watering your lawn uses a lot of water, so only water your lawn when it needs it. Generally, lawns only need an inch or so of water per week.
- **Rain delay.** Watch weather forecast to avoid "Mother Nature" re-watering your garden, which could also damage plants.
- **Pick your plants wisely.** Purchase varieties that require less water and remain hearty in drier weather. And don't forget to mulch (only 2-3") to help with water retention.
- **Be a leak detective.** Find and fix leaks and breaks in hoses, sprinkler systems and pipes. For help, download New Jersey American Water's [Leak Detection Kit](#).
- **Raise the blade.** Raise the level of your lawnmower blade to avoid lawn burnout and the need for watering.
- **Keep an eye out.** Watch your sprinkler's "sweep" to make sure all the water is reaching vegetation that needs it and not the pavement! Check this frequently in case a person or animal has accidentally redirected your sprinkler.





### Breakdown of Hillsborough Township Cases As Reported by Hillsborough Township Health Department


Daily Case Count



Positive Hillsborough Township Cases by Age Range




Deceased by Age Range

Please be advised that the numbers posted here and on the Township website are those that are reported by Hillsborough Township Health Department based on reports from the NJ Department of Health surveillance system. The reported numbers are only from those individuals who have been tested for COVID-19 and are confirmed positive through an FDA approved laboratory for COVID-19 testing purpose. It does not include those contacts of the positive individuals or any individuals, who are sick and have not been tested.

\* Confirmed cases and confirmed deceased from Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities may not also be included in the total number of cases above.

The number of cases from the above section by age and deceased cannot be added to the Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities confirmed cases and confirmed deceased to get a total case count and a total deceased count. The reason for this is that there are different reporting mechanisms in place capturing that data. The NJ Department of Health surveillance system obtains reports from State run labs. The Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities utilize many different labs, State, out-of-state and private, therefore, their numbers are not completely reflected in the total Hillsborough numbers from the State system at this time. That withstanding, you cannot simply add the two sets of numbers either to get a total case count, as some of

the LTC/ALF numbers are counted in the State system.

**If you are a Hillsborough resident and have tested positive for Coronavirus / COVID-19, please contact the Health Department at 908-369-5652.**

The Hillsborough Township Health Department continues to monitor all cases and is working with the State to identify any potential contacts for follow-up. A representative from the Hillsborough Township Health Department will reach out to all individuals determined to have been in close contact with the positive testing persons within 24-48 hours of each case being confirmed.
