

Special Bulletin: COVID-19 UPDATE



Due to the current COVID-19 situation, Hillsborough Township is taking the following precautions to minimize person-to-person contact in an attempt to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus.

- Closures and cancellations of meetings and programs are posted on our website and can be accessed by clicking the scroll at the top of the site or by visiting this [link](#).
- All Senior Programs have been cancelled until further notice. Senior busing will be available for doctors appointments. Seniors should contact our Social Services Department if they need assistance in obtaining items from the grocery store.
- Beginning Monday, March 16 through Sunday, March 22, the Library System will be closed to the public. The Library System will continue to evaluate and communicate future plans as information becomes available. For more information visit the SCLSNJ [website](#).

- It can cause severe illness like SARS.
- Currently, no treatment or vaccine is available.

SYMPTOMS:



FEVER SHORTNESS OF BREATH COUGH

HOW IS IT SPREAD?

BY AN INFECTED PERSON:

- Within 6 feet of you.
- That coughs or sneezes near you.

FROM SURFACES:

- Touching an object that has the virus on it, then touching your face



PLAN AHEAD:

- Have an emergency plan in case children can't go to school or you can't go to work.
- Talk to your employer about alternative work arrangements.
