

Apex Sports and Events (Apex) Project Takes Next Steps



Complex Offers Both Indoor and Outdoor Recreational Activities

"Hillsborough Township and Somerset County are excited to announce the anticipated expansion of facilities adjacent to Mountain View Park with the inclusion of Apex Sports & Events, expected to open in 2019," announced Mayor Gloria McCauley at Tuesday's Township Committee meeting. The next step in the process is for Apex to go before the Planning Board on April 5th for site plan approval.

Somerset County, in partnership with Hillsborough Township, preserved 369 acres to establish Mountain View Park which provides local residents with year-round sports and recreational opportunities. The Apex development complements the existing facilities at Mountain View Park and will offer outdoor artificial turf fields as well as an indoor sports complex. The indoor sports complex will also boast an artificial turf field, basketball and volleyball courts, and a kids' adventure area with rock climbing and other family-friendly activities.

"This type of facility will play a key role in satisfying the need for additional sports activities for our residents," stated Hillsborough Mayor Gloria McCauley.

HTPD Honors Top Cops

The Hillsborough Township Police Department continues its Top Cop program intended to recognize the performance of its top rated Officers. The award recipients are determined based upon a score obtained from their Annual Job Performance Evaluations, along with a ranking achieved from their respective supervisors and peers. As a result of their hard work, an acknowledgement of the award is placed in the Officer's permanent Personnel File and a special award bar is presented to each Officer, to be worn above his uniform badge. In addition, the Officers' names will be engraved on a plaque displayed in the lobby of Police Headquarters memorializing each year's winners since the program's inception in 1996. The two officers selected for this year's program are Patrolman Paschall and Patrolman McCarthy.

Patrolman Paschall has been a member of the Department since 2001, and has served in both the Patrol and Investigative Divisions. He is the recipient of several Command Citations and received the Department's Medal of Merit in 2003 for capturing carjacking suspects. He also received the MADD Law Enforcement Distinguished Service Award in 2014 for his efforts in enforcing DWI Laws. This is his second year in a row being selected as Top Cop.

Patrolman McCarthy has been a member of the Department since 2008, and has served in the Patrol Division during the entirety of that time. He is the recipient of several Command Citations, as well as several Supervisory Commendations. He also serves as one of the Departments Field Training Officers. This is his second time being selected as Top Cop, having previously been selected in 2015.

Maintaining Easement surface area is Homeowner's Responsibility

Please note that property owners are responsible for maintaining the surface area of easements located on residential property. This includes swales, drainage ditches, streams, etc. If the areas where the easement is located needs attention due to downed trees or, silted, blocked or settled surfaces, the maintenance is handled by the private property owner. The Township does not own the property. The easement exists to allow a utility company access to underground utilities or to provide drainage from uphill areas. The utility company and/or the Township are only responsible for the underground piping and/or wiring. The easement restricts property owners from altering or blocking these drainage flow easement areas.

Homestead Benefits

The State of New Jersey has processed payment of the 2015 Homestead Benefit Credits. The Finance office will be mailing revised 2018 2nd quarter tax bills to those individuals who received this credit. This year, 2,048 Hillsborough property owners received the rebate, for a total of \$587,782.20.

VFW Patriots Pen Award Winner From Hillsborough Middle School

Each Fall the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) sponsors a National Patriots Pen youth essay contest. More than 132,000 students in grade 6-8 enter the contest nationwide. The national first place winner is awarded \$5000 and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, DC. The first-place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling \$54,500.



The essay contest encourages young minds to examine America's history, along with their own experiences in modern American society by drafting a 300 to 400 word essay expressing their views based on a patriotic theme. This year's theme was "America's Gift To My Generation". Student essays are submitted to the local VFW Posts for judging competition and on to the District, State and National levels. Cash awards are presented at the local Post and District levels also.

Hillsborough Memorial VFW Post # 8371 judged entries from the Hillsborough, Montgomery and Branchburg school districts producing a winning essay along with a second and third place finisher. Each award winner was presented with Certificates of Merit and award checks of \$300 for 1st, \$200 for 2nd and \$100 for 3rd place.
