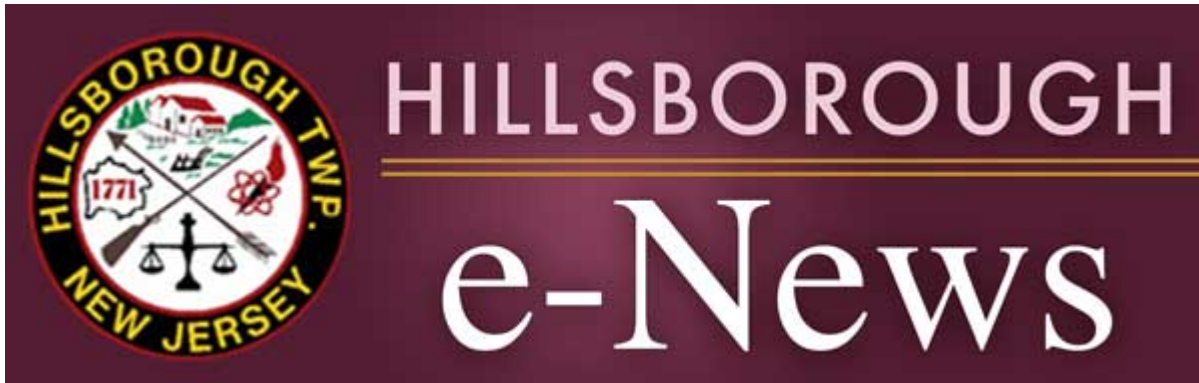

Road Projects Updates in Hillsborough Township

Grant to Fund Phase 1 of Beekman Lane Falcon Road to be Repaired Route 206 Bypass Next Phase

Mayor Gloria McCauley provided an extensive infrastructure update regarding the various roadway projects for the Township.

"We are excited to announce that the Township received a N.J.D.O.T. local aid grant of \$508,000 for the repaving of Beekman Lane Phase 1 which is between Amwell Road and Triangle Roads," announced Mayor Gloria McCauley.

She further went on to thank the Assistant Township Engineer, Mr. Tom Belanger and the Engineering Department for applying for the grant. The original estimate was for \$538,000 so this grant is almost the entire amount. Provided there aren't any unforeseen issues with the section of the roadway the project could possibly be brought in under budget. The Engineering Department will now bid the project this year for construction by the end of this year or early next Spring.

Engineering

*Falcon Road
Update*

The Engineering Department would like to inform the public about the condition of Falcon Road. The eastbound lane of Falcon Road is deteriorated and our Department of Public Works has been patching the roadway almost daily, but with 260 miles of roads within the Township this is a monumental task.

The developers of the Gateway Development are responsible to rebuild this roadway which will include widening, drainage improvements, curbing and sidewalk on one side.

The hold-up is that there are two (2) property owners along Falcon Road still negotiating with the developer on the cost of the additional land acquisition for the road widening and the road continues to deteriorate. Since this land acquisition does take time and sometimes court action is necessary it appears we are still months to a year away.

The Township Administration and Staff has recently met with the developer and the developer has committed to do temporary paving repairs on the eastbound lane within the next few weeks, weather permitting. This temporary paving will be more than just patching as our Department of Public Works is doing constantly, so the driving surface should be better until the road is fully rebuilt.

Please understand what is involved and on behalf of the Township Committee, we are working on the condition of Falcon Road.

Online Tax Payment System Upgrade

The Township's online tax payment system will be going through a security upgrade for the next week. This upgrade will provide even greater security for your financial information. During this upgrade, you will not be able to make credit card payments, but will be able to make online tax payments. The upgrade will be completed over the weekend and the credit card option will be available again on Monday March 5th.

Health Department

Septic System Maintenance

Spring really is just around the corner! When making your spring cleaning list, don't forget your septic system maintenance. The Hillsborough Health Department would like to remind all homeowners with onsite wastewater treatment systems (septic systems) to make sure they maintain their system. Maintaining a septic system is important to keeping it working for many years to come. The septic system consists of a tank and a disposal field. Solids settle out in the tank, and the dirty water from the tank is treated by bacteria in the disposal field. If the tank isn't pumped out at least every 3 years, the solids will enter the disposal field and clog and destroy it, costing thousands of dollars. In addition to making sure your tank is pumped regularly, you should also do the following:

- Don't dispose of hazardous household waste in the sinks or toilets.
 - Don't drive over or park on the disposal field.
 - Don't use too much water at once - practice water conservation, try not to use laundry and dishwasher at the same time.
 - Plant only grass over and around your disposal field.
 - Don't add commercial septic tank additives to speed up decomposition
 - Don't construct anything that will encroach upon any part of the septic system- contact the health department for setback requirements.
 - Don't put nonbiodegradable substances into your system such as diapers, cat litter, cigarette filters.
 - Don't hook up sump pumps or floor drains to your septic system
 - Don't empty hot tubs, jacuzzi, or water softener waste into the septic system.
 - Fix all leaking faucets and toilets
 - Be sure to pump your septic tank every 2 to 3 years. Keep track of the pumping dates.

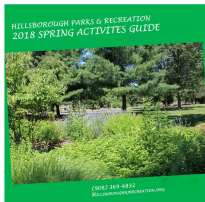
Pothole Repairs

For example, from December 1778 to June 1779, General George Washington made the Wallace House in Somerville his Winter headquarters. In 1842, tracks of the first railway, the Elizabethtown and Somerville Railroad, were extended into Somerville. And in September 1922, Reverend Edward W. Hall and Eleanor Mills were found murdered in a field in Somerset, launching Somerset County's most notorious court case.

In partnership with the NEH, Somerset County's municipal and county libraries will be collecting, cataloging, and preserving the collective memories of Somerset County residents while also hosting programs to highlight the rich history of the County.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Often called the silent killer, carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

- » CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards. For the best protection, interconnect all CO alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- » Follow the manufacturer's instructions for placement and mounting height.
- » Choose a CO alarm that has the label of a recognized testing laboratory.
- » Call your local fire department's non-emergency number to find out what number to call if the CO alarm sounds.
- » Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- » If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries. If the battery is low, replace it. If it still sounds, call the fire department.
- » If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door. Make sure everyone inside the home is accounted for. Call for help from a fresh air location and stay there until emergency personnel.
- » If you need to warm a vehicle, remove it from the garage immediately after starting it. Do not run a vehicle or other fueled engine or motor indoors, even if garage doors are open. Make sure the exhaust pipe of a running vehicle is not covered with snow.
- » During and after a snowstorm, make sure vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, and fireplace are clear of snow build-up.
- » A generator should be used in a well-ventilated location outdoors away from windows, doors and vent openings.
- » Gas or charcoal grills can produce CO — only use outside.

HOME HEATING EQUIPMENT

Have fuel-burning heating equipment and chimneys inspected by a professional every year before cold weather sets in. When using a fireplace, open the flue for adequate ventilation. Never use your oven to heat your home.

FACTS

- ! A person can be poisoned by a small amount of CO over a longer period of time or by a large amount of CO over a shorter amount of time.
- ! In 2005, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 61,100 non-fire CO incidents in which carbon monoxide was found, or an average of seven calls per hour.
