Swift911 delivers brief, informational messages to residents via text message, email and phone message.

Residents are reminded to check their Swift911 settings to ensure they are receiving up to date information. Messages range from updates on upcoming events to emergency notifications and closures.

Log in and check your settings or create an account if you don't already have one.

Go to the <u>Swift 911 Portal</u>. If you do not already have an account, c lick the "Register Now" button at the top of the page and complete all of the required information. Upon completion of the registration, you will receive an email with a confirmation code from SwiftReach Networks link to confirm your profile.

If you already have an account, you can select or deselect how you receive notifications (phone calls, emails, text messages) right from the log in screen or you can log in to subscribe and unsubscribe from various lists.

Building Department

Some Minor Work will no longer Require a Permit Due to changes enacted and mandated by the New Jersey Department of Consumer Affairs, work once considered to be "Minor Work" may now fall under the category of "Ordinary Maintenance." Work considered to be Ordinary maintenance does not require a permit. Some of the most significant changes include:

- Roof repair or replacement (1 & 2 family detached dwellings only)
- Replacement of Plumbing Fixtures (like for like and no piping changes)
- Installation of burglar or security system in a 1 & 2 family dwelling

Downed Tree Branches are Homeowner's Responsibility The Engineering Department would like to inform residents that any tree or tree branches that fall into your yard, even if from your neighbor's tree, become your responsibility to clean up and and repair damage to your property. If your tree falls into the roadway or sidewalk, D.P.W. will clear the obstruction in those areas and place the downed tree on the residents property for their removal. If you have a Homeowners Association with private roads you can contact your Association Representative.

Neighbors trees that fall on your property are considered a civil matter between neighbors. The Township has no authority to require a neighbor to pay to remove the fallen tree. There are standard laws not Township Regulations about tree requirements. Please contact your Homeowners Insurance Company for advice.

Sewer Project Assessment Payments online beginning on 5/1 The Township recently received a request from the residents of the Sanitary Sewer Project to be given the ability to pay their Quarterly Special Assessment via the online system. The Finance Department was able to work with our 3rd party vendor and residents will be able to make a free online payment from their checking account effective with the June installment. Health Department

Accidental poisonings are a major public health problem.

The 56th Annual Poison Prevention Week is March 18th-24th It is estimated that more than 2 million poisonings each year are called in to poison control centers across the country. More than 90% of these occur in the home, and most of the poisonings involve children under age 6. However, about 92% of the poisoning related deaths involve adults.

The Health Department would like to bring your attention to resources that you can use to prevent poisoning in your family and pets. The NJ Poison Prevention Hotline: www.njpies.org and 1-800-222-1222, which appears on the Health Department website under "important phone numbers" is a 24/7 free hotline for residents who may have a potential emergency, and also for information. It now includes information on pet poisoning, so you can call if you suspect your pet may have been poisoned.
