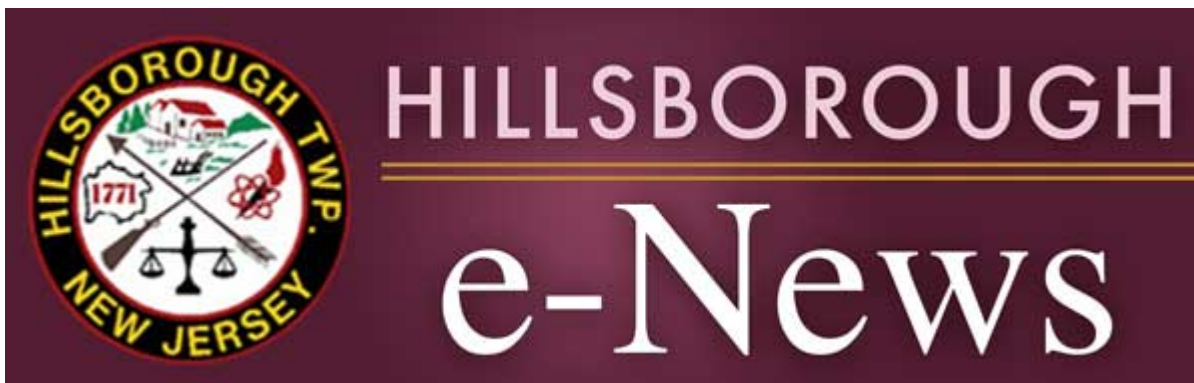

April is National Donate Life Month

Realizing the urgent need for donors around the country, the National Donate Life Month observance was established in 2003, to promote a greater understanding about the life-saving benefits of donation. Established in 2012, National Donate Life Blue and Green Day represents a national effort to support and raise awareness for organ, tissue donation and transplantation.

The New Jersey Organ and Tissue Sharing Network is committed to addressing that need through enhanced awareness .

Donors not only give the gift of life, but also often restore health and sight to the recipients of the tissue and organs.

People of all ages, ethnic backgrounds and religions are affected by the need for organ transplants; and there are nearly 5,000 New Jersey residents and over 120,000 Americans awaiting life-saving and life-enhancing transplant operations.

The Township Committee recognizes National Donate Life Month and National Blue in addition to Green Day on April 13, 2018 as a great opportunity to join in the fight to save lives by giving the greatest gift.

April is Parkinson's Awareness Month

Parkinson's Disease is a chronic, progressive, neurological disease and is the second most common neurodegenerative disease in the United States.

Parkinson's disease is currently estimated to affect approximately one million people in the United States and the prevalence will more than double by 2040. It is the 14th leading cause of death in the United States according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Research suggest that the cause of Parkinson's disease is a combination of genetic and environmental factors, but the exact cause and progression of the disease is still unknown. There is no objective test or biomarker for Parkinson's disease, and there is no cure or drug to slow or halt the progression of the disease.

Increased research, education and community support services such as those provided by the Parkinson's Foundation and other organizations are needed to find more effective treatments and to provide access to quality care to those living with the disease today.

The Township Committee declares April as National Parkinson's Awareness Month and urges residents to support the search for a cure and assist those individuals and families who deal with this illness on a daily basis.

Hillsborough Celebrates National Library Week

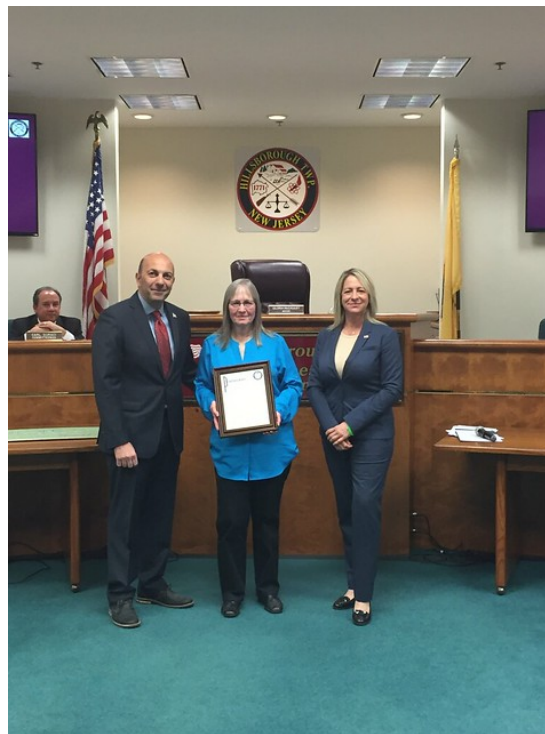
The theme for 2018, "Libraries Lead", helps raise awareness of the critical role libraries play in today's digital society.

Building Department

Construction Season is Here

Now that the weather is getting warmer, construction season is here. The Building Department recommends residents do research before choosing a contractor. It is important to know the contractor you're hiring is licensed, has knowledge of NJ Construction Code, is familiar with the permit & inspection procedures, has a good reputation (check with the Better business bureau or online reviews), charges fair rates, and performs quality work. NJ.COM recently published a very insightful article giving tips on what to look for when searching for contractors and how to choose the right one for you.

Engineering

Property owners are responsible for maintenance and upkeep of their storm water facilities

The Engineering Department reminds property owners (mainly businesses and homeowner associations) that they are responsible for maintenance and upkeep of their storm water facilities (i.e. detention basins, catch basins, piping etc.) Lack of maintenance will cause additional flooding to adjoining properties. In addition, per Township Ordinance, all property owners with private storm water facilities are required to submit a report to the Engineering Department each year certifying that storm water facilities are maintained and operating as designed.

infections are in people ages 15 to 24. If left untreated, these diseases can cause infertility, as well as other serious health problems. One kind of STD, Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) can cause cancer, but it can now be prevented by vaccinating adolescents. Information about this vaccination is on the Hillsborough Health Department website. Many of these diseases can be cured or treated and all it takes is GETTING YOURSELF TESTED. The Centers for Disease Control Recommends regular testing by risk level for early detection, and you can read more about it at the CDC link on the Hillsborough Website under "health" and "disease prevention". You can be tested at your physician's office, or at Zufall Health in Somerville, or other locations in NJ. You can see the link to these sources on the Health Department Website.

Free Seedlings to be Distributed to Residents on Saturday, April 28th

Free tree seedlings will be available to Hillsborough Township residents on Saturday April 28th as part of the New Jersey Tree Recovery Campaign. This program helps communities replace trees damaged or destroyed by Superstorm Sandy.

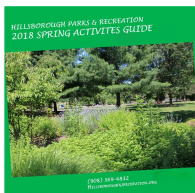
This Saturday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. residents will be able to pick up tree seedlings at the Township Auten Road Facility. Seedlings, available on a first come, first served basis, also come with instructions on how to store, care for, and plant them. The guides help residents choose the right place on a property to plant a tree while keeping in mind the tree's full-grown size in the future. Residents should plant the seedlings within two days after pick-up in order to prevent the roots from drying out.

The goal of the Tree Recovery Campaign is to distribute over 500,000 tree seedlings to New Jersey residents over the course of five years. It is a joint effort between Hillsborough Township, New Jersey Forest Service, New Jersey Soil Conservation Districts, Sustainable Jersey, Arbor Day.

The Department of Public Works would like to remind residents that there is no curbside pickup for tree debris. If you are a professional, or have a family member or loved one that you are concerned about overdosing on opioids, get prepared.

During the 45-60 minute training session, you will learn how to:

- recognize the signs of an opioid overdose
- understand the steps required to save a life from an opioid overdose
- have a clear understanding of the Overdose Prevention Act
- know how and where you can acquire Narcan (a.k.a Naloxone - the opioid overdose reversal medication)
- have the opportunity to get Narcan at little or no cost (must bring insurance info.)
- receive a certificate in opioid overdose prevention training
