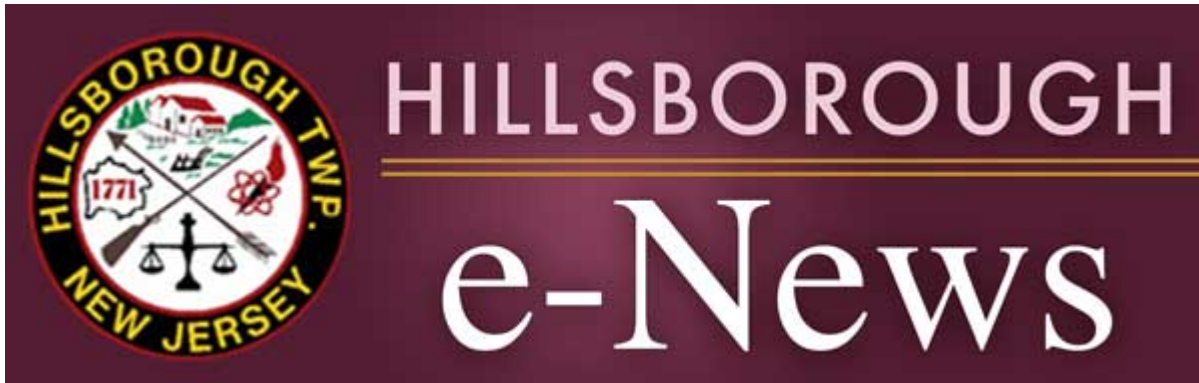

Do I Need a Permit for a Shed?

Please be advised that a Building Permit is required for sheds that meet the following criteria:

1. More than 200 Sq ft
2. Structure is higher than 10 ft
3. If shed has electric, water, gas, oil, or sewer connections.

Please, make sure to check with the Zoning Department first.

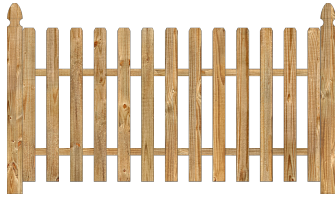

*Installing a Fence?
Follow these
Guidelines*



The Engineering Department has provided the following information pertaining to fence construction.

Standard 6 foot high fences do not require a permit on residential lots. Fences proposed on commercial/business properties do require approval/permits from the planning/zoning office.

Any fence proposed over 6 foot high does require a permit from the construction department.

Although residential properties do not require a permit if under 6 foot, the following rules should be followed:

1. Call for mark-out of utilities prior to any fence construction.
2. Fences can not be installed within any easement on the property. Easements can be for utilities, storm sewers, drainage swales, conservation areas etc. Property owners must check their private surveys, as the Township does not have surveys on file.
3. Fences can not be installed in the road right-of-way along the frontage of a property. The right-of-way is the area along the roadway where sidewalk and utilities are installed. This area is typically 10 to 15 feet from the edge of roadway.
4. Fences can not be installed in sight triangle easements at road intersections. Even if sight triangle easements are not listed on a survey, fences can not block sight visibility at road intersection.
5. It is recommended that property owners have their property lines located by a licensed surveyor so fences are properly installed and not encroach on adjoining properties.
6. It is recommended that fences be installed a few feet in from the property line so the fence owner can maintain the backside of the fence without having to enter your neighbors property.

*Create Your Family's
Hurricane
Preparedness Plan*

Family's Hurricane Preparedness Plan

**Planning ahead can help you feel better prepared for the hurricane season.
Get your family prepared in three key steps:**

1 BUILD A KIT

Consider your family-specific needs to ensure you have at least 10 days of supplies.

- Store a gallon of water per person per day. In case your supply runs out, pre-identify safe sources of water, use water filters or boil water.
- Gather a 10-day supply of non-perishable foods for each person. Pay particular attention to individuals with special diets and allergies, babies, toddlers and the elderly. Nursing mothers may need liquid formula.
- Canned dietetic foods, juices and soups may be helpful for ill or elderly people.
- Have hand sanitizer, antibiotic ointment, hygienic products, diapers and wipes for children and older adults.
- Get food, water and a collar with identification tags for your pet.
- Have at hand a favorite toy, books and coloring book and crayons for the children.



2 MAKE A FAMILY PLAN

Identify alternate ways to stay in touch with loved ones.

- Choose an out of town friend or relative as a point of contact.
- Decide on a meeting place in case you cannot return home.
- Keep important documents and phone numbers with you at all times.
- Include children in preparedness discussions and make sure they have emergency contacts memorized or saved in a secure place.
- Identify the closest shelter in case you are ordered to leave your home, and let your family know its location.



3 STAY INFORMED

Listen for up-to-date information before, during and after a disaster.

- Local media will provide evacuation details and shelter locations.
- Make sure your battery-powered radio is working and you have extra batteries.
- Download the FEMA App to receive severe weather alerts, safety tips and much more.

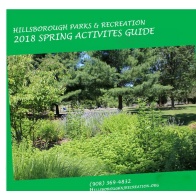

Who Owns What?

Ownership Guidelines for Your Home's Electrical System

When your home's exterior electrical system is damaged, it's important to understand which components are our responsibility and which are yours.

If you receive overhead electric service, we are responsible for the following components:

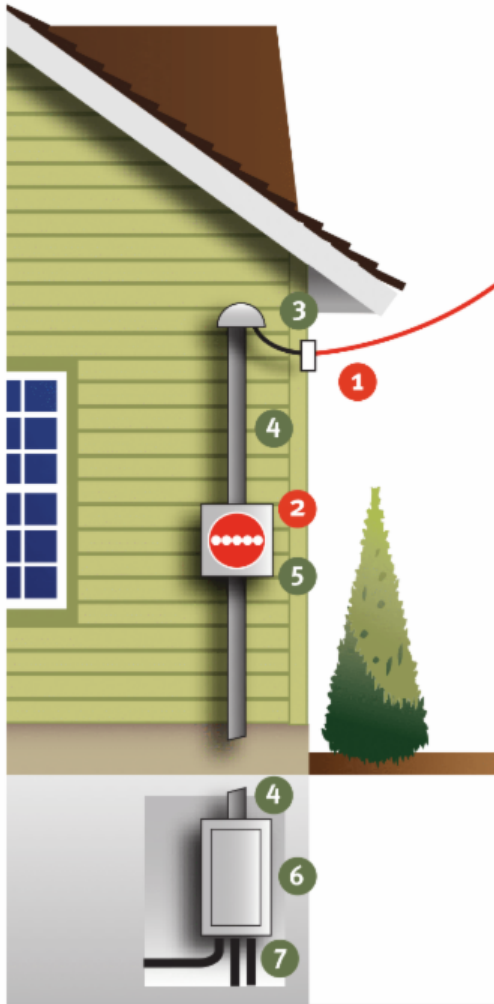
- 1. Service Drop** – The wires running from the utility pole to your home.
- 2. Electric Meter** – Measures your electricity use in kilowatt-hours.

You own and are responsible for repairing the following:

- 3. Weatherhead and Insulator** – This is the point where our electric lines connect to your home.
- 4. Service Entrance Cable** – The wire that extends from your weatherhead to the meter and from the meter to your fuse box or circuit breaker box.
- 5. Meter Base** – Your meter is mounted in this box.
- 6. Fuse Box or Circuit Breaker Box** – This is the main service panel that houses your fuses or circuit breakers.
- 7. Household Wiring** – The interior wiring that distributes electricity through your home.

As a customer, it's also your responsibility to maintain open access to the meter and keep obstructions away from power lines that extend from the utility pole to your home. If trees on your property grow near power lines, don't prune or remove them yourself. Consult with a tree contractor who is qualified to work around electric equipment.
