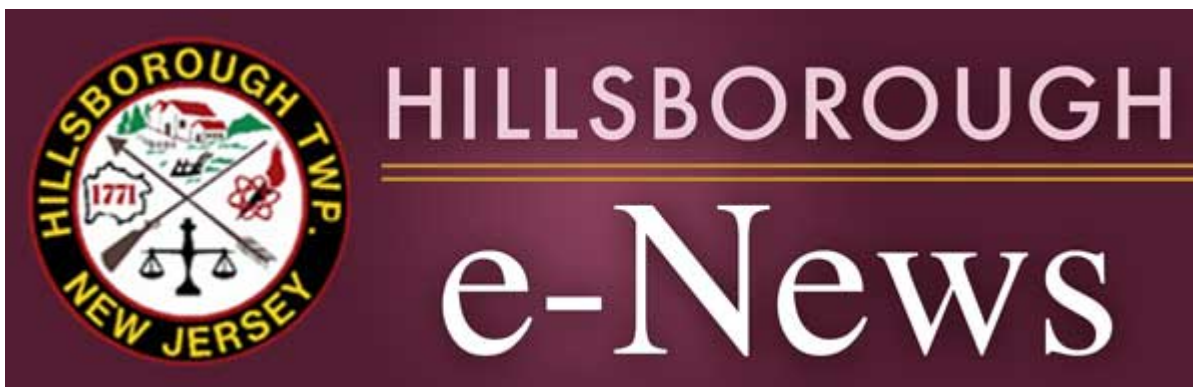

Jacob Dylan Miller, a Senior at Hillsborough High School and a member of Boy Scout Troop 186, has recently earned the rank of Eagle Scout.

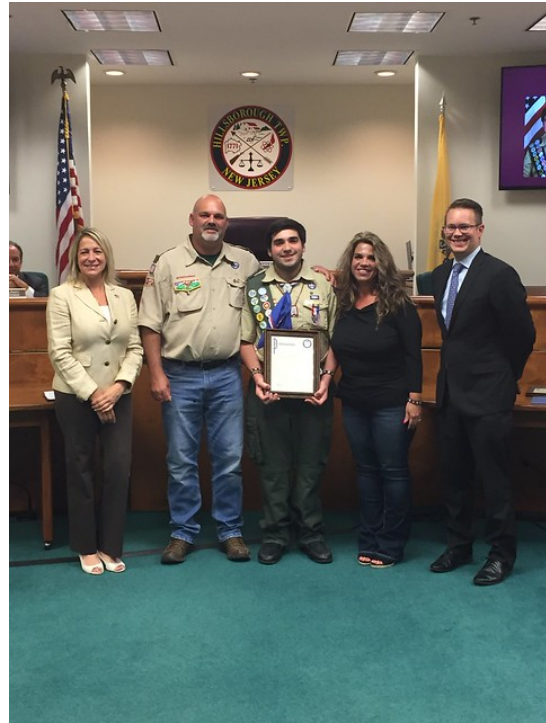

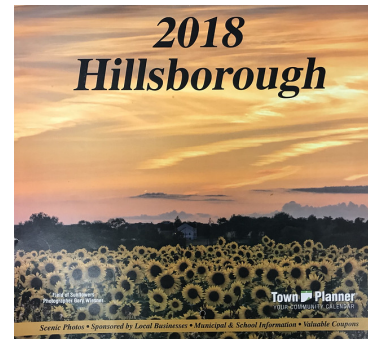

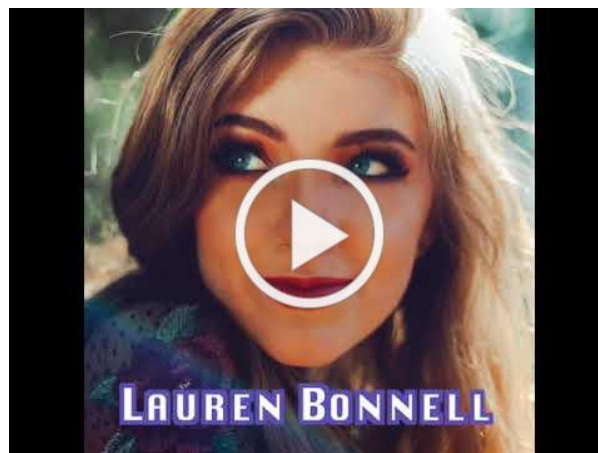
Join the Hillsborough Music Festival!



Department Updates

Building Department

Closing Out Permits

With summer here, it is the peak of the construction season. Don't forget, once you receive your Construction Permit it is important to get all of your inspections. Permits will remain open until all final inspections have passed. This is important to remember, especially when selling your home!

Engineering

Summer has arrived and many homeowners may want to improve their property by adding or removing soil.

Soil Permit Ordinance

The Engineering Department is advising residents to be cautious about accepting soil for their property. Some have accepted soil from locations which could possibly contain debris, rubble or other contaminants. In one case, a resident accepted "free" soil which ended up being contaminated material. The homeowner had to pay to have the soil removed and afterwards learned the soil was from a construction site. The free soil turned out to be a very expensive undertaking. It is recommended you purchase soil from an approved soil supplier or make sure they are certified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Agency.

Hillsborough Township has a Soil Permit Ordinance designed to protect residents against such occurrences. It prohibits the importation of soil without first obtaining approval from the Engineering Department. If the soil is from an unknown source lab testing of the soil will be necessary. If you are thinking of improving your property, before you either remove or accept soil, dirt or other fill material, be sure to contact the Engineering Department to advise and obtain the proper permit. The Hillsborough Engineering Office can be reached at 908-369-4460.

Following the proper procedures can save residents from significant costs associated with removal of contaminated soil as well as preventing penalties.

Finance

3rd Quarter Estimated Tax Bills

The 3rd Quarter estimated taxes were mailed on July 11th. These bills only reflect the amount due for the 3rd quarter until the Township receives the certified tax rate from the county. If you earned a Shop Hillsborough credit, this bill will reflect that reduction. Please be aware the estimated tax bill is a single sheet that is pink and white, and that payment is due no later than August 10th.

Recall Information

Recently, the Health Department was informed that there were 2 recalls of commonly consumed food products that residents should be aware of. Recalled items include certain types of Ritz Crackers, and certain types of Pepperidge Farms Goldfish Crackers. Firefighters Support Girl Scout Cookie Distribution Day 2018

Girl Scouts in Hillsborough delivered more than 34,600 boxes of cookies to hungry customers in town and around the country. In addition, more than 1,800 boxes were donated to military personnel through Operation Jersey Cares.

This year, as in many prior years, Hillsborough Fire Company No. 2 offered Girl Scouts the use of the Route 206 Firehouse to support the massive undertaking, clearing out their trucks and equipment on March 17th to make room for more than 2,400 cases of cookies, all staged and organized for pickup by dedicated Troop Leaders and Troop Cookie Managers.

On cookie distribution day, cars roll through the two bays of the firehouse every few minutes for more than three hours in a well-orchestrated and incredibly efficient assembly while Girl Scouts and Hillsborough High School Honor Society students, friends and colleagues load car after car and verify distribution paperwork.

Girl Scout Volunteer Cookie Team Leads, Dana Shapiro, Nancy Giordano, Pat Szary and Michelle Tomenchok coordinated the cookie sale across all 70 Hillsborough troops, which culminated in Cookie Distribution Day.

"Given March weather is always a bit unpredictable, the firehouse is the perfect spot for Cookie Distribution Day since it is covered and has the drive through lanes. The use of the firehouse is a critical part of the entire process," said Ms. Shapiro, "and we are so appreciative of the firemen and their support of our efforts."

The firemen really make Girl Scouts feel welcome and there is a real sense of sharing community resources," said Ms. Giordano. "Girl Scout cookies are a 100 year tradition, and an opportunity for young girls to learn important business skills. We enjoy helping the troops learn how to work hard and earn money that they can put toward their troop activities."

Girl Scouts, in Hillsborough, is an active and busy organization with more than 500 school-aged girls participating and several hundred adult volunteers coordinating activities and leading troops. Girl Scouts start in kindergarten and continue through high school.

NEW school supplies – such as notebooks, three-ring binders (1½ to 3 inches), pencil cases that fit inside binders, paper, glue sticks, safety scissors, index cards, highlighters, markers, pens, pencils and crayons – will be accepted along with new or gently-used backpacks.
