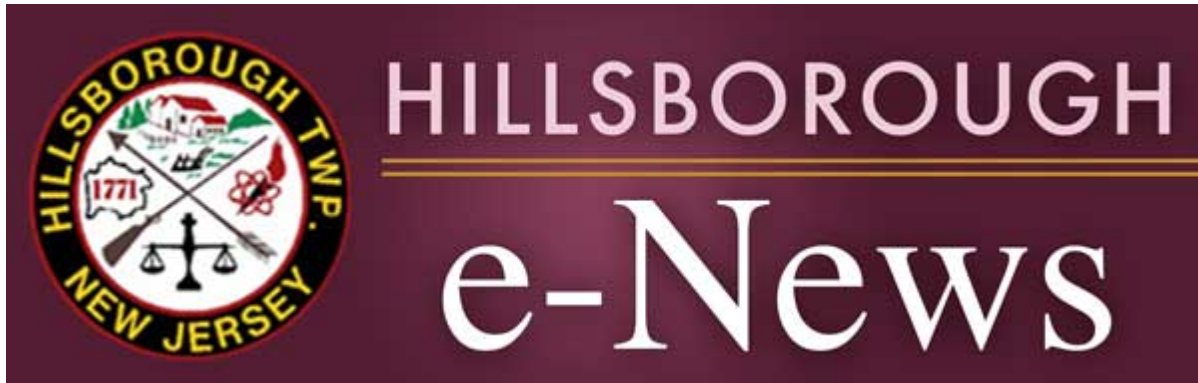

[Mayor DelCore Held Town Hall on Affordable Housing](#)

Last Thursday Mayor Frank DelCore held a Town Hall Public Information Session regarding New Jersey State mandates relative to Affordable Housing. The purpose of the session was to assist the public in understanding the topic of affordable housing and its corresponding impact on municipalities. There was a panel of presenters with various expertise providing valuable information. These presenters included Mayor Frank DelCore, Deputy Mayor Doug Tomson, Assemblywoman Holly Schepisi, Jennifer Beahm of Leon S. Avakian, LLC and Eric M. Bernstein of Bernstein and Associates, LLC, Township Administrator Anthony Ferrera, and Township Planner David Maski.

Approximately 50 residents attended Thursday night's session to learn more about affordable housing and the impacts for Hillsborough. 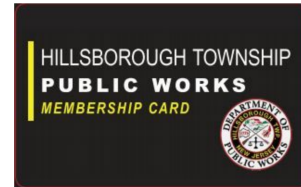

Department Updates

Building

The time for pool installation is upon us. For a residential pool, before submitting a permit to the Building Department, you must obtain any required prior approvals from Zoning and Engineering. In order to avoid any delays, it is important to make sure your application is complete. There are handouts available in the Building Department for pool application requirements. Please make sure to read the handouts thoroughly when filling out your application. All the required information is explained within these handouts. If you have any further questions please contact the Building Department.

Commercial / Public Pools have other requirements: there are annual requirements for Commercial / Public pools in town. Please see the Building Department for those requirements.

Engineering

Modifications are being made to the left turn signal at the intersection of Triangle Road and Auten Road.

The contractor started construction a few weeks ago and installed the footings and underground conduits. The new steel poles and signal

Finance

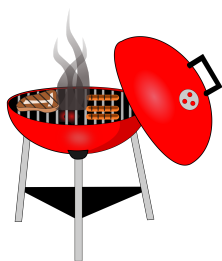
The first payment by the State of New Jersey for the Homestead Benefit has been received and applied to your May taxes. You should have received a small pink bill in the mail in the past week which reflects the new amount due for your 2nd quarter taxes. If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company, they have been notified as well.

Grill Safety



There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food and with the hopeful onset of spring weather it is even more prevalent. However, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Here are some tips:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.

Police

Public Works

The Department of Public Works is diligently working on the preliminary aspects of the upcoming road improvements. Riverside Drive from Clawson Avenue to River Rd will be having tree work completed to remove diseased Ash trees. This will ensure this type of work will not have to take place after the road has been improved.

Tree seedlings will be handed out to our residents at our Auten Road facility up this Saturday between 7 am and 3 pm. This program is part of the State of New Jersey's Tree Recovery Campaign.

NEW JERSEY TREE RECOVERY CAMPAIGN

In 2012, superstorm Sandy left many communities with dead and damaged trees. The New Jersey Tree Recovery Campaign is a partnership between the Arbor Day Foundation and the NJ State Forestry Service. The campaign focuses on "rebuilding trees to homeowners and communities who lost their urban canopy in the wake of Hurricane Sandy."

As reported by the Arbor Day Foundation, more than 332,002 trees have been distributed to date and many more are still needed. Hillsborough Township has partnered with these organizations to provide our residents with seedlings to replace missing trees.

On April 27th between 7am and 3pm, Hillsborough Township Department of Public Works will distribute 4"-24" high bare root tree seedlings to residents at our Auten Road facility. Each resident can receive up to 3 seedlings. Seedlings are limited and distributed on a first come, first served basis. You do not need to be registered for the annual clean up program in order to obtain the seedlings. Hillsborough residents will be required to show proof of residency upon arriving at the site.

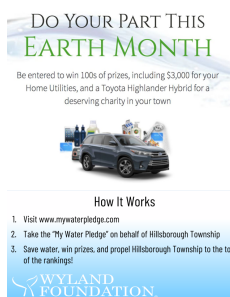

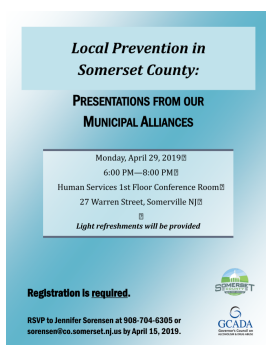

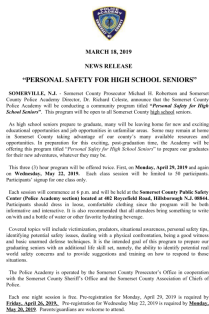
