

"We are pleased to announce the combination of the Fireworks Celebration with the Hillsborough Music Fest this year," added Mayor DelCore.










<u>Dual Stream Recycling Program Expanding to Include More Hillsborough Neighborhoods</u>

The Somerset County Recycling Division is providing two 65-gallon wheeled recycling totes to residents. Each tote has a different color lid (yellow and lime green). Stickers on the lids indicate what materials are to be placed in the totes. Regular scheduled pickups with the new totes will begin on your next scheduled recycling date after delivery of totes. The tote with the lime green lid is for the cardboard and paper products, and the tote with the yellow lid is for commingled glass, cans, and plastic materials.

Department Updates

Building

Construction season is upon us! Make sure to obtain all prior approvals before submitting permit applications to the Building Department. Once you receive your Construction Permit, it is important to get all of your Inspections. Permits will remain open until all Final Inspections have passed. This is important to remember, especially when selling your home!

Engineering

The left turn lane modification to the Triangle/Auten Road traffic signal has been completed. The new poles and heads were installed recently and the wiring and electrical connections were finished earlier this week. The new signal is operational and the old poles have been removed.

For all those residents who participate in the Shop Hillsborough program, the credits earned in the past 12 months will be posted to your tax account in June, and the tax bill received for August will reflect that reduction.

Health

Measles Update

Over 800 people in 23 states have been affected by measles this year. Most of those cases have been in the New York metro area, in very close proximity to Hillsborough. In order to prevent the spread of measles, and to protect our vulnerable population, anyone who is exposed to measles may be quarantined for several weeks if they do not have proof of vaccination or immunity.

Please be ready. Have your vaccination records handy. If you don't know whether or not you were vaccinated, or if you have immunity from having the disease, please talk to your doctor about getting vaccinated, boostered, or having a blood test to prove immunity. The vaccination has been studied thoroughly for many years, and it is over 90% effective (2 vaccines are 97% effective). Please help to protect yourself and your community. Be ready.

Flood water and Flash Floods -

Remember:

DO NOT drive onto a flooded roadway

Reminder to residents - Turn Around - Don't Drown Mayor's eNewsletter: Issue 2019-23 - June 7, 2019

- DO NOT go around barriers
- DO NOT drive through flowing water. If you approach a roadway
 that is flooded, TURN AROUND DON'T DROWN. It takes just
 12 inches of rushing water to carry away a small car, while 2 feet
 of rushing water can carry away most vehicles. It is NEVER safe
 to drive or walk into flood waters.
- Drive with extreme caution if roads are even just wet or it is raining. You can lose control of your vehicle if hydroplaning occurs, which is when a layer of water builds up between your tires and the road, causing there to be no direct contact between your vehicle and the road.

Social Security Administration Scam

Never provide your contact information to the caller. Ask for a call back number. Do not automatically enter your information into the key pad. Only provide such information on a call that you initiate with the respective agency.

Never leave a child unattended in a car

Never leave a child unattended in a car. Not even for a minute. Always lock your car and secure the keys so that your kids can't get to them. Warn your children about playing in and around cars.

Left alone in a vehicle, even for a short time, a child is in danger of:

- Abduction.
- Injury.
- · Dehydration.
- Death.

If reported to the Police you will be referred to the Department of Child Protection and Permanency and may face criminal charges.
