Update from Hillsborough Health Department: Highlighting Safety Standouts

During our observational surveys and inspections, the Hillsborough Health Department has come across some exceptional attention to detail while conducting restaurants. We'd like to take the time to highlight some businesses who have raised the standard for the health and safety of the community and their workforce while conducting business operations.

Our first recognition is to Best Taste Asian, located at 378 South Branch Rd. Upon reopening their restaurant, they went above the New Jersey State guidelines for Covid-19 safety precautions. This includes a vestibule entrance with a slide basket at the window to safely transfer payment and food. They have gloves and sanitizer present as well as always having their masks on. Additionally, Zhi Lin has reduced her staff to family only to ensure social distancing within the workplace.

With these new protocols and their new set up, Best Taste Asian has gone above and Beyond the standard for limiting exposure and possible transmission of disease.



Update from Hillsborough Parks and Recreation Department:



Reminders from Hillsborough Police Department:

Be Aware Of Contact Tracing Scams

State and Local Officials are warning residents to be aware of contact tracing scams. In no instance would a legitimate contact tracing analyst ask you for your social security number nor your bank information. Therefore, if that information is attempted to be ascertained by a Contact Tracer DO NOT PROVIDE IT, as that is a scam.

In the case of a legitimate Contact Tracer Analyst reaching out to you the type of information they would be obtaining would be related to your symptoms, who you have been in contact with, including where you work and who you live with.

Again, do not provide your Social Security Number nor your banking information to anyone over the telephone.

A Contact Tracer Analyst would not TEXT you either. If you receive those types of TEXT messages, delete them.

Update from the Building Department:

Any pool capable of holding 24" or more of water requires Building and Zoning Permits, pool barrier, etc. If new Electrical outlets or power feed needs to be installed to run the filter, then an Electrical Permit is also required. For Building Department website.

Update from Department of Public Works:

The Annual Clean-Up Program will take place at the Auten Road Site. The free program is offered to residents to allow them to dispose of unwanted items. Residents wishing to participate in any of the Department of Public Works programs must first sign up for the Public Works Membership Program.

Some operational safety changes are being made to facilitate the social distancing requirements. Masks will be required to enter the Auten road facility, residents not complying with this request will be turned away. The facility will be open from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. People scheduled to participate in the program will receive an email in advance of their date with any new changes and safety requirements.

The Senior Curbside pick up program will take place during the month of July starting on the 6th. Complete detailed information on this program will be made available on the Public Works link off of the township website. If you have previously participated in this program you will receive a post card in your regular mail asking you to confirm your registration either by phone or email.

National Public Works Week is May 17th - May 23rd






Breakdown of Hillsborough Township Cases As Reported by Hillsborough Township Health Department


Please be advised that the numbers posted below and on the Township website are those that are reported by Hillsborough Township Health Department based on reports from the NJ Department of Health surveillance system. The reported numbers are only from those individuals who have been tested for COVID-19 and are confirmed positive through an FDA approved laboratory for COVID-19 testing purpose. It does not include those contacts of the positive individuals or any individuals, who are sick and have not been tested.

Total Hillsborough Cases*









* Confirmed cases and confirmed deceased from Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities may not also be included in the total number of cases above.

The number of cases from the above section by age and deceased cannot be added to the Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities confirmed cases and confirmed deceased to get a total case count and a total deceased count. The reason for this is that there are different reporting mechanisms in place capturing that data. The NJ Department of Health surveillance system obtains reports from State run labs. The Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities utilize many different labs, State, out-of-state and private, therefore, their numbers are not completely reflected in the total Hillsborough numbers from the State system at this time. That withstanding, you cannot simply add the two sets of numbers either to get a total case count, as some of the LTC/ALF numbers are counted in the State system.

If you are a Hillsborough resident and have tested positive for Coronavirus / COVID-19, please contact the Health Department at 908-369-5652.

The Hillsborough Township Health Department continues to monitor all cases and is working with the State to identify any potential contacts for follow-up. A representative from the Hillsborough Township Health Department will reach out to all individuals determined to have been in close contact with the positive testing persons within 24-48 hours of each case being confirmed.

Finance / Tax Collector Update:

The schedule for in person CASH only tax payments will be Tuesdays, from 9 am until noon, and Thursdays, from 1 pm until 4 pm.

Please keep in mind that taxes were due May 1st, however the grace period has been extended until June 1st (the last day of the grace period) and cash payment will be accepted that day from 9 am to 3 pm.
