


Township Seeking Historic Scenic Photos for the 250th Anniversary Edition of the 2021 Town Calendar

Get Ready for Flu Season - Hillsborough Health Department to Hold Flu Vaccination Clinic On September 24th

It's more important than ever! The Hillsborough Health Department and Green Brook Family Practice will sponsor the 2020 flu vaccinations for Hillsborough residents. The clinic will be held on Thursday, **September 24th** at the Hillsborough Municipal Building. Senior Citizens and high risk individuals with chronic conditions only will be admitted from 1:30 to 3:30 pm, and all other residents, ages 6 months and up, will be admitted from 3:30 to 6:30 pm. Mayor's Opioid Team Shares Information on Opioid Overdose Reversal Drug Naloxone

Naloxone can reverse overdoses from opioids by blocking the effects of opioids on the brain. NJ Human Services is

making naloxone available for free September 24th to 26th at participating pharmacies throughout New Jersey. New Jerseyans will be able to visit participating





pharmacies and anonymously obtain naloxone without a prescription or an appointment. Hillsborough locations are CVS at 220 Triangle Road, Shoprite Pharmacy Of Hillsborough at 601 Route #206 & Amwell Road and Weis Markets at 315 Rt 206. Other locations can be found at <u>NJ Human Services website</u>.

Those who obtain the drug will also be given information regarding addiction treatment and recovery through Reach NJ, a 24-hour-a-day, 7 day-a-week addictions hotline where people who have Substance Use Disorder (SUD) or friends and family of people with SUD can get immediate assistance and support from live, New Jersey-based, trained addiction counselors. An individual who calls the program's toll-free number, 844-ReachNJ (732-2465), will reach a live staff member who will help connect you to treatment.

2020 General Election

US Post Office Card Misstates NJ 2020 Election Process - Every Active Voter in New Jersey will Automatically Receive a Vote by Mail (VBM) Ballot

New Jersey postal customers received post cards from the United States Postal Service this week that gave incorrect information about the process for Garden State voters to cast their ballots in the 2020 general election. The cards urged voters to request vote by mail ballots early, but in New Jersey all active voters will receive ballots automatically.

"We will be mailing ballots to every active registered voter in Somerset County by October 5, and they should be received by October 10," said Somerset County Clerk Steve Peter. "The only reason to submit a Vote by Mail ballot request is if you ballot is lost or damaged and you require a replacement."

If voters have not received their ballot by October 10, they are encouraged to contact the Clerks' office at (908) 231-7013 to determine if a new ballot should be mailed. Voters cannot request a second ballot if they have already submitted one.

Some polling locations will be open in NJ (at least one per municipality and 50% of the locations overall), but only for voting by paper provisional ballots (only those with disabilities that prevent them from using a paper ballot may use a machine, and will have to sign an affidavit) or (new this time) to drop off their own voted VBM ballot. 
