[Proclamation Honoring Devin Arriaga](#)

At the October 26th Township Committee meeting, Mayor Shawn Lipani read a proclamation honoring the heroic efforts of HHS graduate and Hillsborough resident Devin Arriaga.

On September 1, 2021, Tropical Storm Ida brought severe rain to Hillsborough causing extreme flooding. Jessi Andruzzi was leaving work and attempting to get home via Gemini Drive when her car started filling up with water. The water picked up her car and began pulling it into the creek causing the electrical panel to short out. Ms. Andruzzi climbed through her sunroof and screamed for help as the waters rose to dangerous levels and the current increased in intensity.



19-year-old Devin Arriaga was home helping his mother in their flooded basement, heard Ms. Andruzzi's screams, and ran to help. In fact, he jumped into the raging waters, pulled Ms. Andruzzi from the car, and carried her to a nearby fence where they both held on to avoid getting pulled into the current. Several times Ms. Andruzzi let go of the fence and Devin grabbed hold of her to protect her from the raging waters. Thanks to Devin's extreme courage and bravery, Jessi Andruzzi was rescued from her car and then saved again as she was pulled away from the fence into the rushing waters.

Devin received a standing ovation at the Township Committee meeting for his heroism and he is to be applauded for his heroism, and outstanding example of selflessness.

In-person early voting has begun in Hillsborough. Anyone who is registered to vote can participate in early voting at the Municipal Building. Voting hours are Monday through Saturday from 10 am until 8 pm and Sunday from 10 am to 6 pm. The last day of in-person early voting is October 31st.

Halloween Safety Tips

Chief Michael McMahon would like to remind

residents of safety precautions for those participating in various Halloween festivities, in addition to offering suggestions to parents of young children who “Trick or Treat” from door to door at this time of year.

The following precautions are intended for a safe and happy time for all Township residents.



- Wear light-colored clothing that's short enough to prevent tripping and add reflective tape to the sides, front, and back of the costume
- Make sure children can see well through face masks or cosmetics
- Adults should accompany young children
- Go out in daylight and carry a flashlight after nightfall
- Stay within family neighborhoods and/or visit homes that you know
- Watch for traffic
- Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy
- Examine all candy before allowing children to eat it
- Keep control of pets as they may react unexpectedly to children in costumes

Additionally, please remember also to adhere to Township Halloween Curfew regulations for October 28th to November 1st, between the hours of 10 pm and 6 am, in which no person under the age of 18 years shall be permitted on any public place, public street, or public property in the Township of Hillsborough unless such person is in attendance at a program or function sponsored by the municipality, a church or school. This section shall not apply to persons under the age of 18 years while they are returning home from a place of employment, school, fraternal or religious meeting or going to and from a doctor's or dentist's office, where treatment has been rendered or is to be rendered, or to persons under the age of 18 years who are accompanied by a parent or guardian over the age of 21 years.

Simple precautions can go a long way in making this Halloween a safe one.

DEP, NJDOT Urge Motorists to Beware of Deer and Drive with Extra Caution

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) is reminding drivers to be extra vigilant on roadways this fall as the mating season for white-tailed deer gets underway and daylight hours decrease.



Deer are more likely to suddenly enter roadways at this time of year, also known as the fall rut, as bucks pursue does, increasing the risk for sudden stops or collisions. Deer activity is more likely to occur during early morning hours and around sunset, when visibility may be difficult and more motorists are on their work commutes.


