# Officer Dillon Kelly Receives Lifesaving Award

At the October 26th Township Committee meeting, Mayor Shawn Lipani presented Hillsborough Township Police Officer Dillon Kelly with a proclamation honoring him for receiving the CPR Lifesaving Award.

On June 6, 2020, at approximately 6:46 am, Officer Kelly was dispatched to the Royce Brook Golf Club on the report of an unconscious male. Upon his arrival, he found that John McDonald was not breathing and had no pulse. Officer Kelly began lifesaving measures by performing CPR and continued until he was relieved by first responders from Robert Wood Johnson EMS.



The valiant actions of Officer Kelly serve as an example of the highest standards of the Hillsborough Township Police Department through his heroism and willingness to help others.

# Officers Desmond and Rivera Receive Lifesaving Award

At the October 26th Township Committee meeting, Mayor Shawn Lipani presented Hillsborough Township Police Officers Joseph Desmond and Dennis Rivera with a proclamation praising them for their lifesaving efforts and for receiving the CPR Lifesaving Award.

On February 27, 2020, Officers Desmond and Rivera were dispatched to a residence on a report of an unresponsive person with CPR in progress by a family member. The two officers found no pulse and continued lifesaving measures including attaching a defibrillator until the victim then began

to move and breathe on his own.

Hillsborough Township extends its sincere gratitude and congratulations to Officers Desmond and Rivera for saving the life of a Hillsborough resident and for being shining members of our community.

# Officers Johnson, Michaels, and Ott Receive Lifesaving Award

At the October 26th Township Committee meeting, Mayor Shawn Lipani honored Officers John A. Johnson, Christopher Michaels, and Tyler Ott with a proclamation honoring them for saving the life of a Hillsborough Township resident.

On February 1, 2020, Officers Johnson, Michaels, and Ott were dispatched to a residence on a report of a 76-year-old



unresponsive female. The three officers took over CPR and lifesaving measures, including attaching a defibrillator; and continued with life-saving measures for 14 minutes until EMS arrived and it was discovered that the victim had regained a pulse.

The diligent efforts of Officers Johnson, Michaels, and Ott serve as an example of Hillsborough Township Police Department's high standards and we applaud these three role models for helping to make Hillsborough one of the best places to live in America.

# Hillsborough's Railroad Quiet Zones Re-Certified

Each of the four railroad crossings of the Norfolk Southern line in Hillsborough Township has been re-certified by a licensed engineer and the Federal Railroad Administration.

On April 27, 2021 and May 4, 2021, a licensed Professional Engineer from Pennoni Associates, Inc. inspected each of the four highway-railroad

grade crossings on the Norfolk Southern line located in Hillsborough Township. Each of the four crossings was found to be in compliance with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 222, Appendix A, Approved Supplementary Safety Measures.

"It is important that the Township continues to monitor and comply with the safety requirements," said Mayor Shawn Lipani.

Additionally, it was Veteran and Purple Heart Recipient Ted Dima who was instrumental in having Hillsborough become a Purple Heart Community," stated Mayor Lipani.

# It's Beginning to Look a Lot Like Leaf Season!

With shorter days and colder weather upon us, the Hillsborough Township Department of Public Works is gearing up to kick off the fall leaf program. The purpose of the leaf program is to assist residents with the removal of fallen leaves. The program starts in November and continues through mid-December, or until there have been two passes throughout the town. It takes approximately 3-4 weeks to complete one pass through the entire town.



To participate in the leaf collection program, residents must rake leaves to the curb or street right-of-way before the beginning of their scheduled week of collection. A tentative schedule will be posted in the Mayor's e-news and on the Township website. Please keep in mind this is a tentative schedule and is subject to change with weather conditions, equipment breakage, and manpower.

# **Litter Did You Know**

Why use reusable bags and recycle one-time use bags?

The Numbers Are "In The Bag"

- Our state alone uses 4.4 billion plastic bags annually.
- Every day we do not act on this problem, 12 million more plastic bags could end up in our streets, landfills, and oceans. That's just plastic bags.
- Plastic pollution, including plastic straws, threatens more than 600 species by means of ingestion and entanglement, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. It acts as a sponge for contaminants present in our waterways, adsorbing PCBs, DDT, oil, and pesticides.
- Single-use polystyrene, or Styrofoam, takes more than half a millennium for a Styrofoam cup to break down.
- Single-use polystyrene, or Styrofoam carries toxins that move up the food chain to endanger human health.
- Use of plastic products leads to ingestion and/or inhalation of large amounts of both micro-plastic particles and hundreds of toxic substances with known or suspected carcinogenic, developmental, or endocrine-disrupting impacts.


