Hillsborough Purple Heart Recipient Will Serve As Special Guest Speaker for Annual Veterans Day Ceremony

Hillsborough Mayor Shawn Lipani announced that longtime Hillsborough resident Ted Dima, a Vietnam Veteran who serves as Senior Vice Commander of Chapter 27 of the Military Order of the Purple Heart, will lead Hillsborough's Annual Veterans Day Ceremony on Thursday, November 11, 2021, at 6 pm at the Garden of Honor.

"We are honored to have Ted Dima, an Army combat veteran who was wounded in action and served our nation during one of the most difficult periods of the war in Vietnam, be our guest speaker this year. Additionally, it was Veteran and Purple Heart Recipient Ted Dima who was instrumental in having Hillsborough become a Purple Heart Community," stated Mayor Lipani.

- Crew in Chamberlain Drive Area, Orchard Drive Area, Wagner Lane Area, Deer Path Area, and Flagtown Area



Have you always wanted to know more about easements? For example, what they are, and who maintains them?

An easement is defined as a right to cross or otherwise use someone else's land for a specified purpose.

Who maintains easements?





Easements that are located on residential and commercial properties are the property owners' responsibility to maintain the surface area. This includes swales, drainage ditches, streams, etc. If the area where the easement is located needs attention due to down trees, silted, blocked, or settled surfaces, the maintenance is handled by the private property owner.

Single-Use Straw Law

The NJ Single-Use Plastic Straw Law went into effect on November 4, 2021. Food-service businesses may provide single-use plastic straws to a customer only upon request. Consumers will still be able to purchase packages of straws and beverages prepackaged with a straw, such as juice



Litter Did You Know

If we do not recycle properly, much of it can wind up in a landfill.

Purchasers of recyclables only pay for material that is clean, dry and free of any contaminants (items that cannot be recycled that are mixed in). When recyclable materials are wet, dirty, or are mixed with non-recyclable material, the entire load, including materials that are recyclable, will be disposed of in a landfill as it is too costly to sort through what is usable and what is not.

- **DO** <u>remove caps</u> on plastic bottles and put them in the trash. They cannot be recycled.
- DON'T recycle wet cardboard and pizza boxes. Cardboard must be dry and clean. You can tear off any greasy or wet parts and recycle the rest.
- DON'T recycle <u>broken glass</u>. It contaminates other recyclables and jams recycling machines.
- DON'T put <u>recycling into plastic bags</u>. They cause jams and delays in recycling processing.
- DON'T recycle <u>small, long, thin plastic or metal items</u> like wire, wire hangers, strips of plastic, etc. They cause costly recycling equipment shutdowns.
- DO remember, if you are not 100% sure if the item is recyclable, "WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!!".
